<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Maths</u></b></p> <p>We will be identifying numbers through subitising, exploring how numbers are made and comparing amounts.</p> <p>We will continue to represent numbers using a range of resources.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>How can I help my child?</u></b></p> <p>Playing board games with your child and focusing on talking about how they know the number on the dice and counting on the number of spaces.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Personal Social Emotional Development</u></b></p> <p>To consider the patterns and routines of our day.</p> <p>Continuing to navigate interaction between other children in the classroom.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>How can I help my child?</u></b></p> <p>Talk to the children about their learning. Encourage the children to take responsibility for their belongings and getting ready for school where appropriate.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Physical Development</u></b></p> <p>Dough Gym/ Finger Gym</p> <p>Learning to work together by playing physical games to get active</p> <p>PE – Our PE sessions are on Monday and Wednesday</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>How can I help my Child?</u></b></p> <p>Practise the letter formation sent home on the back of the word lists.</p> <p>Funky finger / dough gym activities from the 6 week in meeting information.</p>

Perhaps go on an autumn walk and collect some autumn 'treasures' to make an autumn collage with.
